BREAKFAST AT TIONG BAHRU MARKET & FOOD CENTRE

Start your morning like a champion with an authentic local breakfast at the well-known Tiong Bahru Market & Food Centre, just like Caroline. There, you'll find yourself immersed in myriad of culinary delights. Take your pick from Michelin rated stalls like Tiong Bahru Hainanese Boneless Chicken Rice and Hong Heng Fried Sotong Prawn Mee, or – here's a tip from the locals – simply ask any Singaporean for their top recommendation, then you'll be certain to be in for a treat.

KAMPONG GLAM: BEST OF BOTH WORLDS

Kampong Glam is one of Singapore's oldest and most vibrant precincts. Over the centuries, it has been populated by the Malay, Bugis and Arabs. Today, Kampong Glam is Singapore's Muslim Quarter, and the rich multi-cultural heritage and traditions can still be seen.

Dotted with candy-coloured shophouses that are now occupied by traditional trades alongside indie boutiques and vintage stores, bars, and eateries; the community spirit and upbeat atmosphere ensures a memorable experience for everyone.

Arab Street's Sultan Mosque (Masjid Sultan) was first built in 1824 and holds great significance for Singapore's Muslim community. Known for its magnificent golden domes and wide prayer halls, the Sultan Mosque is one of Singapore's national monuments.

Situated at Kampong Glam's Sultan Gate, the Malay Heritage Centre is a beautiful 180-year old building which was once home to Malay royalty, and therefore a perfect location for the hundreds of artifacts that tell the impressive story of the Malay culture. While visiting, Caroline learned how to play the "Kompang", a traditional Malay drum.



ISLAND ADVENTURE AT SENTOSA

Take flight at Sentosa with these adrenaline-inducing rides for the adventure-seeker. iFly Singapore is the world's largest themed wind tunnel for indoor skydiving, a great activity for all ages.

With the Megazip ride, one can experience both speed and exhilarating action while drinking in unparalleled views of the South China Sea. At 75 metres high, the 450-metre journey can reach speeds of 60km/hour!

A hit with kids and adults alike, the Skyline Luge is a must-do at Sentosa. Whether you take a leisurely cruise or race down the track, the adventure does not end at the finish line. Board the Skyride chairlift to the top of the hill for another run, taking in panoramic views of Singapore's city skyline and the coastline of Sentosa Island.



DINNER AT CANDLENUT

Peranakan cuisine is a culinary tradition unique to Singapore, and is definitely a must-try when visiting. Candlenut is the first Peranakan restaurant to be awarded a Michelin star and is widely well regarded for its authentic flavours, yet modern and experimental approach. Local chef Malcolm Lee's creations shine through in his "ah-ma-kase" (wordplay on the Japanese term "omakase") tasting menu, which strongly reflects the traditional Peranakan culinary skills which he learned from his Nonya mother and grandmother at a young age.



CARRIE K JEWELLRY WORKSHOP

Participate in a jewellery making workshop with Carrie K., famed local designer and silversmith, and create your own piece of unique jewellery.

After dark, Singapore's hip and trendy turn to its sprawling network of watering holes and nightlife hotspots.
